

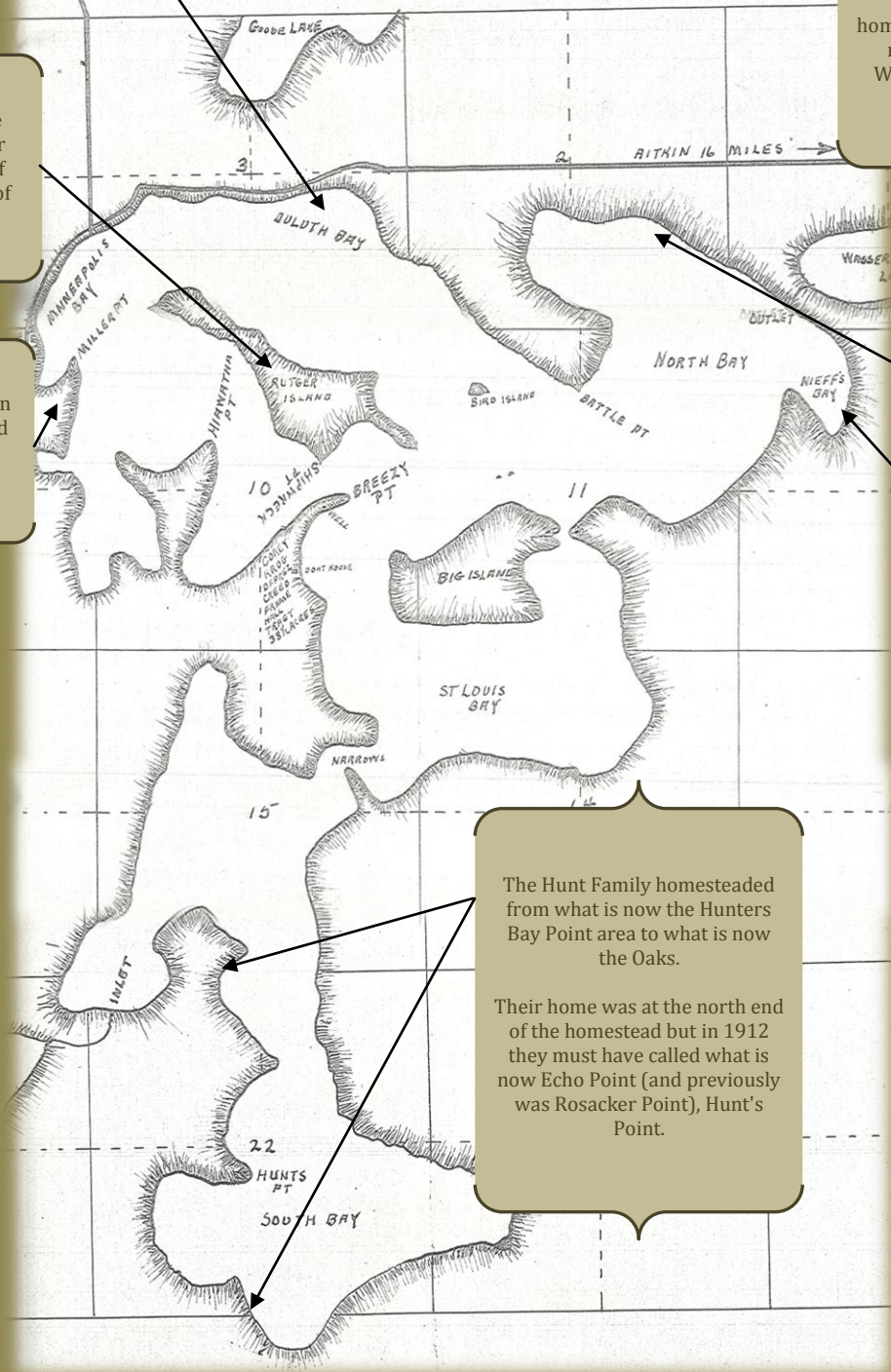
Bay Lake

Nick Newgard was the original homesteader but he sold to the Hall Family from Duluth. That may have caused this area to be called Duluth Bay.

Before moving to the mainland, Joe Ruttger homesteaded most of what we now call Ile of Pines.

What we now call Indian Point, was and is owned by the Miller Family.

Tame Fish Lake was originally named Mud Lake but the Wasserzieher family homesteaded the north side so it must have been known as Wasserzieher Lake when the map was drawn.

The Knieff's homesteaded the northeast end of this bay.

This reference to Knieff's Bay seems wrong.

Today this is part of what we call White Hawk.

The Hunt Family homesteaded from what is now the Hunters Bay Point area to what is now the Oaks.

Their home was at the north end of the homestead but in 1912 they must have called what is now Echo Point (and previously was Rosacker Point), Hunt's Point.

This is a copy of a copy of a copy of a map that was drawn in approximately 1912. It shows how the names of bays & points change over time.
